ABOUT THE 2019 GO FOR IT GRANTS AWARDS

Go For It Grants is an awards program to inspire and support people affected by a bleeding disorder to achieve new personal goals.

People affected by haemophilia, von Willebrand disease and other rare inherited bleeding disorders of all ages, anywhere in Australia are eligible to apply.

Go For It Grants were established by Haemophilia Foundation Australia (HFA) with sponsorship from Pfizer Australia.

Application Timeframes and Deadline

The 2018 funding round closes at 5.00pm on 30 November 2019.

Winners will be notified directly and announced in National Haemophilia and on the HFA website www.haemophilia.org.au

GUIDELINES AND ASSESSMENT PROCESS

1. What is the Go For It Grants Program?

The Haemophilia Foundation Australia (HFA) **Go For It Grants** are available to people with bleeding disorders around Australia. They have been developed and administered by HFA. The grants program is sponsored by Pfizer Australia.

2. Your Privacy

The grant is fully administered by HFA and only HFA will hold personal details supplied by applicants on their application form and in any attachments provided by applicants. Applications will only be available to the judging panel and HFA employees and will be held securely at the HFA office.

HFA will take reasonable steps to protect the privacy of applicants, however successful applicants will be asked for consent for HFA to publish details of their award in HFA newsletters and for the promotion of future grants.

Pfizer Australia will not be involved in the administration or judging of the grants and will not have access to any personal details of any applicants, other than details that are in the public domain.

3. Application process and eligibility criteria – please read carefully. If you do not provide sufficient details your application may be excluded from consideration.

- i) Applicants must have a bleeding disorder or be affected by a bleeding disorder in a direct way
- ii) Applications must be made on the form provided
- iii) Every question on the form should be answered carefully so that the judges understand why you want the grant, what it will be used for and how the grant will benefit you or others
- iv) Your application must include an accurate budget outlining the cost of the project or activity to the value of \$2500. Projects costing substantially more or less than \$2500 may not be considered.
- v) Projects must be capable of completion within one year of the grant being made. This may be extended by agreement where the activity does not commence until early in 2020
- vi) Grants will not be given for regular school or university fees or where government or other funding is available for the purpose
- vii) Applicants are required to supply two (2) written references in support of application, including one from a health professional at a Haemophilia Treatment Centre that also confirms the applicant has a bleeding disorder or is affected by a bleeding disorder. The second reference must be from an independent person, and should not be a family member and should address how the activity will benefit the applicant and the likelihood of success
- viii) Applications will be considered on their merit and the expected benefit for the applicant based on the information provided on the application form
- ix) Applicants or referees may be contacted for further information
- x) Applicants must be received by no later than 5.00pm on 30 November 2019
- xi) Applicants will be advised as soon as possible of the outcome of their application by mail or email
- xii) Decisions will be final and no further correspondence will be entered into by either HFA or Pfizer Australia with unsuccessful applicants
- xiii) Grant recipients will be required to provide a report after completion of the activity and this report may be published by HFA with the agreement of the recipient
- xiv) Grant recipients will be announced in National Haemophilia and on HFA websites, www.haemophilia.org.au or www.factoredin.org.au subject to agreement as per Item 2) above

4. Judging Process

- i) HFA will determine the number of grants to be made each year, on the basis of the funds available
- ii) HFA will establish a panel with expertise and interest in education, learning and development and/or personal development to assess applications and to recommend successful applications for funding
- iii) If there are insufficient applications of merit in any year, HFA reserves the right not to allocate all funds available and the remaining funds may be carried over to the next year
