

The Center for Medical Technology Policy is working with patient organisations to conduct a study about how about how a person's mental health outlook might be impacted by receiving gene therapy for haemophilia.

Having a better understanding about the mental health of people with haemophilia will help determine the positive and negative impacts of gene therapy.

Who is eligible?

- Men age 18 or older
- Moderate or severe haemophilia A or B

What steps are involved?

- Completing a screening survey to see if you are eligible
- Providing informed consent
- Participating in a 90-minute interview using online video software
 - Answer questions about your mental health outlook and how you feel about having and treating haemophilia
 - Filling out a questionnaire about haemophilia and your treatment

Will I be paid?

- Yes, you will be paid the equivalent of \$100 USD for completing the interview
- You will have the option to choose an Amazon gift card or direct payment

The Center for Medical Technology Policy will conduct all interviews. Your identity will be kept confidential – you will be assigned a number and your responses will not be linked to your name.
