Von Willebrand Disease - Susie's Journey

Susie's story below is compelling reading and is testament to how important the Haemophilia community is.



When my family was welcomed into the HFWA community 18 years ago after our diagnoses with VWD, I had no idea of the friendships and knowledge I'd gain. I have the opinion that learning is lifelong and adversity can be reframed as an

opportunity to learn. By being in the committee and putting my hand up to help out, I can share my perspective, learn and effect change. I have had the honour of participating in some truly wonderful and important work.

In the early years I felt most material published and conference sessions available was dedicated to Haemophilia and the experience of boys and men. There was one amazing book on VWD but as it was written by a US author some of the content was irrelevant and downright scary, thinking of their medical system. There were a few brochures but they just didn't seem to cover the reality of what we were experiencing as well as what I was hearing from others at camp and the peer events. Now however, we have a range of relevant publications recently launched by HFA that feature a diversity of experience and women's experiences of living with a bleeding disorder. Through attending conference I was able to share my story and contribute to some of this work. Conferences now have sessions about women and VWD - not just a single one either.

Attending the first international symposium on VWD in Prague was such an honour. My story was part of last year's Bleeding Disorder awareness week campaign. I helped plan and spoke at the recent WFH Global Summit on women and girls with inherited bleeding disorders.

Right now, what I'm most excited about is the creation of guidelines for the diagnosis and management of VWD. This is a first step towards benchmarking international best practice. It involved a bit of secrecy (for confidentiality and protecting against conflict of interest), late night telecons, wading through dense and very technical material but also travelling to the US for the first time in my life. I was impressed each time we convened - the panel members, the panel chairs and the methods team all actively listened to and worked to draw out the opinions and experinces of the patient representatives. The guidelines aren't perfect and show how much work there is still needed to improve VWD care. But they're a start. Next step is creating educational materials, for patients as well medical practitioners and policy makers.

A bit like a treasure trail, each thing I've helped with has opened up more possibilities. I want to be part of continuing to improve the lives of all people with bleeding disorders, in recognition of the years of effort put in by other people in the community. We would not be where we are now without the dedication and involvement of so many others. When I've been asked to do something new I try to focus on how this will help others rather than my own concern of not being good enough or not having anything worthwhile to contribute. HFWA is always looking for new ideas, people who have a little bit of time to spare or a willingness to have a go. If you think you might want to try something new or share some skills with us, please contact anyone in the management committee for a chat or Jenny at office - you never know where it might take you

Hemlibra Treatment - a Personal Story



After being asked by the Haemophilia Treatment Centre if I would like to transition over to the subcutaneous treatment Hemlibra product in the new year, I can honestly say I couldn't wait for 2020 to end.

A subcutaneous product (for me) is the next best thing to Gene Therapy. Gone are those cold 4am winter mornings, trying to hit a vein (and keep it going) to get your product in.

I've been having my needles for nearly 32 years now, self-infusing for nearly 22 and I can honestly say those times when you can't get a vein (especially if old faithful fails you) are some of the most stressful moments I've experienced with my condition.

Hemlibra is a tiny insulin-like injection, pretty much pain free and inserted into fatty tissues, preferably either sides of your belly under the belly button, in the front of either thighs or in the outer meaty bit of your shoulders. I myself just do my stomach.


The needle is tiny and you barely feel it penetrate the skin. As the liquid is being injected into fatty tissues and the needle is so small it can be a bit tough the push the plunger and you may get some push back (like when your intravenous needle "came out" of your vein) but don't fret, it's normal and you take it at your own pace and what you're comfortable with.

My maintenance dose based on my weight isn't even a millilitre of liquid. It's simple to draw up, quick and easy to inject and I've been told after long term usage it may have an anti inflammatory effect for some lucky people.

Although I'm still only in the early stages I've spoken to people who have been on Hemlibra since the early trial days and they have nothing but great things to say about how much it's changed their lives.

If you would like to know more about Hemlibra or are interested in possibly getting into it just contact the HTC and I'm sure the lovely ladies in there will be more than happy to answer any of your questions.
